



### **RECAP OF ANNOUNCEMENTS MADE IN 2016**

### 1. From T-score to wider scoring bands

- Students with similar scores in each subject will be grouped into the same <u>Achievement Level (AL)</u>
- 8 ALs, with AL1 being the best
- A student's AL for each subject will <u>reflect his level of</u> <u>achievement</u>, rather than how he has performed relative to his peers
- Reduces fine differentiation between students while still giving parents and educators a gauge of a student's progress at the end of primary school

### **RECAP OF ANNOUNCEMENTS MADE IN 2016**

- 2. Choice order of schools to matter more in posting
  - The PSLE Score will continue to be the first criterion for posting.
  - If 2 students with the same PSLE Score vie for a place in a school, the following tie-breakers will be used:
    - a. Citizenship (Singapore Citizens, Permanent Residents, then International Students)
    - b. Choice order of Schools (NEW for 2021 PSLE cohort onwards)
    - c. Computerised balloting





### **KEY MESSAGES**

- MOE has been <u>moving away from an over-emphasis on academic results</u> to develop well-rounded individuals and give students more opportunities to develop their strengths and interests. <u>The PSLE changes are part of this larger shift</u>.
- The PSLE is a <u>useful checkpoint</u> for students as it gauges their learning pace and needs so as to transit well to the next phase of their education journeys.

### **Guiding parents in making subject choices**

## 1. FOUNDATION SCORING UNDER THE NEW PSLE SCORING SYSTEM

Foundation level subjects support the learning needs of students who require additional support to build up strong fundamentals, and better prepares them for progression to secondary school.

### WHAT WILL IT LOOK LIKE?

■ Foundation grades will range from AL A to AL C, with the following:

AL reflected on result slip	Foundation Raw Mark Range	Equivalent standard-level AL
Α	75 – 100	6
В	30 – 74	7
С	<30	8

For students offering a mix of Standard and Foundation subjects, their PSLE Scores will be the sum of the four AL scores of all the Standard and Foundation subjects they are taking.

### WHY?

- Foundation subjects are graded from AL A to AL C (equivalent to AL6 AL8) In view of the lighter curriculum and assessment load.
- Raw mark range for:
  - □ AL A → Mapped from existing Grade 1 (Foundation), and takes into account that students achieving AL6 in a subject would have demonstrated readiness for that subject's N(A) curriculum under SBB (Sec).
  - □ AL C → Mapped from the existing U grade to ensure that the progression threshold remains unchanged in terms of raw marks, i.e. more than 30 raw marks.

# 2. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR SECONDARY SCHOOL HMTL WHAT WILL IT LOOK LIKE?

• The eligibility criteria are directly mapped from current criteria.

Current	New Scoring System
<ul> <li>(i) Top 10% of PSLE Cohort</li> <li>or</li> <li>(ii) Top 11-30% of PSLE cohort; and</li> <li>A* in MTL or</li> <li>Distinction / Merit in HMTL</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>(i) PSLE Score of <u>8 or better</u> (≈ top 10%) <ul> <li>or</li> <li>(ii) PSLE Score between 9 to 14 inclusive</li> <li>(≈ top 11-30%); <u>and</u></li> <li>AL1 / AL2 in MTL <u>or</u></li> <li>Distinction / Merit in HMTL</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

• Secondary schools will continue to have the flexibility to allow students to offer HMTL, if they are assessed to have high ability and interest in MTL and are able to offer HMTL without affecting their performance in other subjects.

- School-based examination results of P5 and P6 students will be presented in ALs, starting from the 2020 P5 cohort onwards.
- This would help students and parents familiarise themselves with the new PSLE scoring system.
